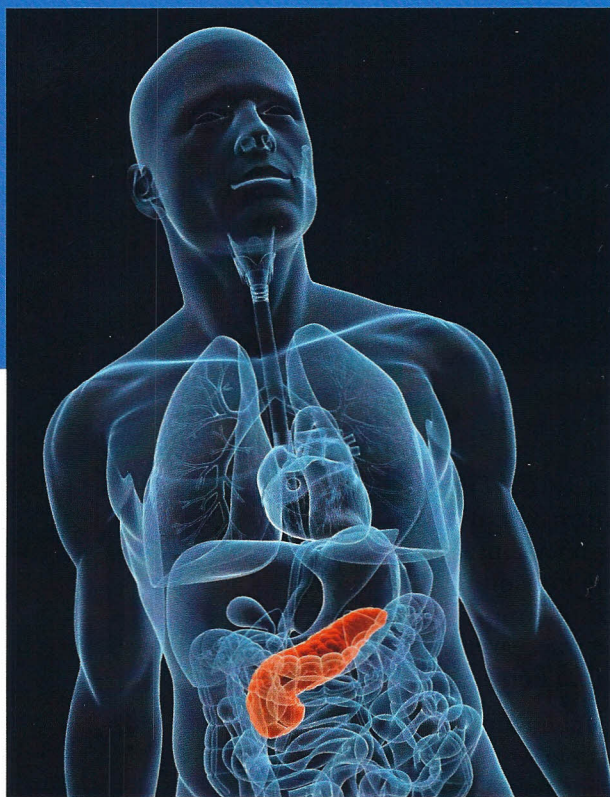


At City of Hope, physicians and researchers seek better ways to battle pancreatic cancer. They are determined to turn the tide against this often intractable illness and save more lives.

THE EXPERTISE TO FIGHT PANCREATIC CANCER

Surgery is currently the only effective treatment for cancer of the pancreas. However, procedures for pancreatic cancer are complicated, requiring the efforts of expert surgeons. City of Hope's medical team features doctors with the skills to handle the complexities of surgery for pancreatic cancer, including removal and reconstruction of fragile blood vessels.

Some patients are best treated with an integrated approach that includes surgery, chemotherapy and radiation therapy. Coordinating a complex treatment regimen requires a team approach, bringing together surgeons, medical oncologists and radiation oncologists with experience managing pancreatic cancer. City of Hope's multidisciplinary team of experts often treats the most complex and difficult cases, giving patients new hope to defeat the disease.
